

Attraction Highlights

Tiananmen Square

Large enough to hold 1 million people, the 440,000-square-metre Tiananmen Square in the center of Beijing is the largest city square, where the sunrise and sunset are observed solemnly with national is hoisted and lowered each day with a ceremony.







Forbidden City

The Forbidden City (Palace Museum) is located at the city center of Beijing. The palace which was once the home of the Emperor and the imperial family. The Forbidden City was enlisted as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1987.



Temple of Heaven

Built in 1420, during the 18th year of the reign of Ming Emperor Yongle, the temple was where emperors went to worship heaven for good harvests.









The Great Wall

The Great Wall was built in China's feudal years a mammoth defense bulwark that serpentines its way across mountains and valleys in the northern part of the country. The Great Wall came under construction in the 7th century BC.



The Summer Palace

As a paragon of Chinese gardens, this huge garden includes Longevity Hill, whose beauty is set off by a multitude of halls, kiosks and trees and Kunming Lake.







Yuanmingyuan Imperial Garden

Known for its extensive collection of garden and building architecture and other works of art,a popular name of Yuanmingyuan in China is the "Garden of Gardens"



The Ming Tombs

The Ming Tombs are scattered across Changping County. Thirteen Ming emperors who ruled China after they moved the capital from Nanjing to Beijing were buried there. The largest is the Changling, built in 1413 for the remains for Zhu Di or Emperor Chengzu. Burial objects are on display from the underground palace of the Dingling, the tomb of the last Ming emperor, Zhu Yijun and his two empresses.





Beijing National Stadium (Bird's Nest/Olympic Stadium)

The Beijing National Stadium, also known as the bird's nest will be the main track and field stadium for the 2008 Summer Olympics and will be host to the Opening and Closing ceremonies.





Beijing National Aquatics Center (Water Cube)

The National Aquatics Center, known as the Water Cube, is an aquatics center that was built alongside Beijing National Stadium in the Olympic Green for the swimming competitions of the 2008 Summer Olympics.



Dashanzi Art District (The 798 Art Zone)

The 798 Art Zone is a art park located in Chaoyang District Dashanzi area. formerly Beijing third radio equipment factory, construction for the East German Bauhaus style. Now it become one of the cultural landmark in Beijing.





South Luogu Lane

Also called Nanluogu Alley ,South Luogu Lane is 786 meters long and 8 meters wide, connecting Gulou East St. on its north and Di'an Men East St. on the south.







The Mansion of Prince Gong

Once the residence of a intellectual in the Qing Dynasty the mansion was first built in 1776-1785. During the first year of Emperor Xian Feng (1851), whose brother who was given the title of prince Gong in 1851. Later the palace was bestowed on the Prince Gong. It is the best preserved Prince palace in Beijing.



Zhoukoudian (The Cave of Peking Man)



Zhoukoudian is located 50 kilometers to the southwest of Beijing and is the former residence of Peking Man, who lived there approximately 200,000 to 500,000 years ago.





Wangfujing Street

Wangfujing Street is the most famous commercial area in Beijing. There are 10 mansions which were once built for noblemen during the Ming Dynasty. The street was named after a sweet-water well on the street. Since Dong'an Market was established in 1903, the area has become a commercial centre in Beijing.

Tour of Lane (Hutongs)

Beijing 's hutongs, lanes or alleys formed by lines of siheyuan (a compound with houses around a courtyard) where old beijing residents live, witness the vicissitude of the city. Hutongs are back alleys where old traditions remain very much alive and kicking. There are about 4,550 in Beijing, near Prince Gong' s Mansion are some of Beijing' s best preserved hutongs. Touring these hutongs by the traditional pedicab is a special travel program of Beijing.


